CHEERMASTER

GENERAL INFORMATION

Type: Appointed by the Senior Patrol Leader

Term: 6 months

Reports to: Assistant Senior Patrol Leader

Description: The Cheermaster is responsible for keeping moral high in the Troop.

Comments: The Cheermaster is the troop clown. He leads activities that keep the other scouts spirits up.

QUALIFICATIONS

Age: 13 or older

Rank: 1st Class or higher

Experience: none

Attendance: 50% over previous 6 months

Participation: Fundraisers & Service Projects

PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS

Training: You must attend the troop Junior Leader Training even if you have attended in the past.

Attendance: You are expected to attend 50% of all troop meetings, Troop Leaders' Council meetings, outings, and service projects. If your attendance is low you can be removed from office.

Effort: You are expected to give this job your best effort.

GENERAL LEADERSHIP RESPONSIBILITIES

Uniform: Set the example by wearing your uniform correctly. This means that you will wear all of the parts of the troop uniform, shirttail tucked in, with all required badges in their correct locations.

Behavior: Set the example by living the Scout Oath and Law in your everyday life. Show Scout Spirit in everything you say and do.

Attendance: Set the example by being an active Scout. Be on time for meetings and activities. You must call the Senior Patrol Leader or Scoutmaster if you are not going to be at a meeting or if you suddenly have to miss an outing. You also need to make sure that someone will assume your responsibilities.

Lead songs, yells, stunts and campfire programs.

Lead game at Troop Meetings

Vary games not using same game twice in two months
