Leadership Position Description

FIRE WARDEN

GENERAL INFORMATION

Type: Appointed by the SPL

Term: 6 Months

Reports to: ASPL

Description: The Fire Warden ensures fire is being used safely.

Comments: The Fire Warden approves the campfire is safe for lighting. He supervises the lighting and extinguishing of all fires, filling the fire buckets, and ensures that the fire is "out cold". He will monitor scouts for proper usage of stoves.

QUALIFICATIONS

Age: 12 or older

Rank: 1st Class or above

Experience: has earned Fireman Chit

Attendance: 50% over previous 6 months

Participation: Fundraisers & Service Projects

PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS

Training: You must attend the troop Junior Leader Training even if you have attended in the past. Earns Fire Safety merit badge within first 2 months of position.

Attendance: You are expected to attend 75% of all troop meetings, outings, and service projects. If your attendance is low you can be removed from office.

Effort: You are expected to give this job your best effort.

GENERAL LEADERSHIP RESPONSIBILITIES

Uniform: Set the example by wearing your uniform correctly. This means that you will wear all of the parts of the troop uniform, shirttail tucked in, with all required badges in their correct locations.

Behavior: Set the example by living the Scout Oath and Law in your everyday life. Show Scout Spirit in everything you say and do.

Attendance: Set the example by being an active Scout. Be on time for meetings and activities. You must call the Senior Patrol Leader or Scoutmaster if you are not going to be at a meeting or if you suddenly have to miss an outing. You also need to make sure that someone will assume your responsibilities.

SPECIFIC LEADERSHIP RESPONSIBILITIES

Ensures fire safety in all troop and patrol situations.
