PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS

Training: You <u>must</u> attend the troop Junior Leader Training even if you have attended in the past.

Attendance: You are expected to attend 75% of all troop meetings, Troop Leaders' Council meetings, outings, and service projects. If your attendance is low you can be removed from office.
Effort: You are expected to given this job your best effort.

GENERAL LEADERSHIP RESPONSIBILITIES

- **Uniform:** Set the example by wearing your uniform correctly. This means that you will wear all of the parts of the troop uniform, shirttail tucked in, with all required badges in their correct locations.
- **Behavior:** Set the example by living the Scout Oath and Law in your everyday life. Show Scout Spirit in everything you say and do.

Shops and compares prices Purchases only the items that support your patrol's menu Spends the least amount of money possible for the food (a scout is thrifty) Pays the cashier Returns the receipt to the Troop Treasurer for reimbursement Brings food on campout – Checks out Cooler from Troop Quartermaster for perishables and uses patrol tote for non-perishables If not attending campout, makes arrangements with Patrol Leader for the food to be purchased for the campout Bring home leftover non-perishables for use at next campout Sets a good example Enthusiastically wears the Scout uniform correctly Lives by the Scout Oath and Law, and shows Scout Spirit Develops Troop & Patrol Spirit
