

## Troop 90 Leadership Position Description

### Patrol Grubmaster

#### GENERAL INFORMATION

- Type:** Appointed by the Patrol Leader  
**Term:** 6 months  
**Reports to:** Patrol Leader  
**Description:** The Patrol Grubmaster is appointed by the Patrol Leader and is responsible for Patrol Camping Food  
**Comments:** Shops for Patrol food and maintains non-perishables for use from campout to campout

#### QUALIFICATIONS

- Age:** none  
**Rank:** none  
**Experience:** none  
**Attendance:** 50% over previous 6 months

#### PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS

- Training:** You must attend the troop Junior Leader Training even if you have attended in the past.  
**Attendance:** You are expected to attend 75% of all troop meetings, Troop Leaders' Council meetings, outings, and service projects. If your attendance is low you can be removed from office.  
**Effort:** You are expected to give this job your best effort.

#### GENERAL LEADERSHIP RESPONSIBILITIES

- Uniform:** Set the example by wearing your uniform correctly. This means that you will wear all of the parts of the troop uniform, shirttail tucked in, with all required badges in their correct locations.  
**Behavior:** Set the example by living the Scout Oath and Law in your everyday life. Show Scout Spirit in everything you say and do.  
**Attendance:** Set the example by being an active Scout. Be on time for meetings and activities. You must call the Patrol Leader or Assistant Scoutmaster if you are not going to be at a meeting or if you suddenly have to miss an outing. You also need to make sure that someone will assume your responsibilities.

#### SPECIFIC LEADERSHIP RESPONSIBILITIES

- Shops and compares prices
- Purchases only the items that support your patrol's menu
- Spends the least amount of money possible for the food (a scout is thrifty)
- Pays the cashier
- Returns the receipt to the Troop Treasurer for reimbursement
- Brings food on campout – Checks out Cooler from Troop Quartermaster for perishables and uses patrol tote for non-perishables
- If not attending campout, makes arrangements with Patrol Leader for the food to be purchased for the campout
- Bring home leftover non-perishables for use at next campout
- Sets a good example
- Enthusiastically wears the Scout uniform correctly
- Lives by the Scout Oath and Law, and shows Scout Spirit
- Develops Troop & Patrol Spirit
