**Patrol Quartermaster**

**GENERAL INFORMATION**

- Type:** Appointed by the Patrol Leader  
**Term:** 6 months  
**Reports to:** Troop Quartermaster  
**Description:** The Patrol Quartermaster is appointed by the Patrol Leader and is responsible for Patrol Equipment  
**Comments:** Maintains inventory of patrol equipment and makes sure equipment is in good working condition

**QUALIFICATIONS**

- Age:** none  
**Rank:** none  
**Experience:** none  
**Attendance:** 50% over previous 6 months

**PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS**

- Training:** You must attend the troop Junior Leader Training even if you have attended in the past.  
**Attendance:** You are expected to attend 75% of all troop meetings, Troop Leaders' Council meetings, outings, and service projects. If your attendance is low you can be removed from office.  
**Effort:** You are expected to give this job your best effort.

**GENERAL LEADERSHIP RESPONSIBILITIES**

- Uniform:** Set the example by wearing your uniform correctly. This means that you will wear all of the parts of the troop uniform, shirttail tucked in, with all required badges in their correct locations.  
**Behavior:** Set the example by living the Scout Oath and Law in your everyday life. Show Scout Spirit in everything you say and do.  
**Attendance:** Set the example by being an active Scout. Be on time for meetings and activities. You must call the Patrol Leader or Assistant Scoutmaster if you are not going to be at a meeting or if you suddenly have to miss an outing. You also need to make sure that someone will assume your responsibilities.

- Keeps Patrol Box in order and available for campouts
- Ensures Scouts are using patrol equipment properly
- Makes suggestions for new or replacement items
- Works with the Troop Quartermaster
- Sets a good example

- Lives by the Scout Oath and Law, and shows Scout Spirit
- Develops Troop & Patrol Spirit
