Clothing and Camping Gear

The intent here is to inform the parents of boys who are considering joining Troop 90 of the clothing and camping gear that will have to be purchased, the approximate cost involved, and the time frame in which the items will be required. In order for a boy to join the Troop, his parents must fill out and turn in a Scout application and registration form for their son along with a check payable to "BSA Troop 90". This initial fee covers the boy's transfer fee from Webelos or initial BSA Registration.

Note: Boy's name should be written on all his clothing and gear. The uniforms and equipment all look alike and are easily mixed with other scouts.

Hiking boots, Backpack (only need for 1 to 3 campouts a year) (available for rent at MR. D's), Sleeping bag (rated at least at 20 degrees or better), Sleeping pad, Rain Poncho or Jacket, Compass, Canteen or water bottle or Camobak, Folding knife (2 to 3 inch blade), Mess kit, Knife fork and spoon, Flashlight.

Note: The Scout uniform, hiking boots, and backpacks are all relatively expensive, so please allow growing room when purchasing these items. Try to allow about three (3) years of growing room in the Scout uniform. When trying on hiking boots, have your son wear two (2) pair of heavy socks; as his feet grow, he can wear successively lighter socks. The backpack should either be a youth or small adult model depending upon the, boy's size. In either case the pack should fit the boy at the time it is purchased, but it should also have provisions (adjustments) for growth. See the Troop leaders for advice in buying and fitting backpacks. Backpacks can be rented as a way of trying different types.
